

What should I do for work?


Where should I live?

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The Typical View of God's Will


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This view of "finding God's will" usually ends up feeling like a divine game of hide-and-seek.

any of us have absorbed a view of "finding God's will" that primarily leads us to a place of frustration. According to this widespread view, God has a singular plan for each of our lives, but he hides that plan from us. In order to receive God's blessings, we have to find out what his secret plan is and follow it like a hidden map of sorts. In this view, God's plan for our life is very narrow and specific, like the bullseye of a target:

In this view, only if we hit the very center are we in God's



will. Anything outside that is not God's will, which means if we don't marry the one specific spouse God has chosen for us, or land the one perfect job, we are doomed to miss out and the best we can hope for is some kind of divine "Plan B." And every time we make any choice out of line with this hidden plan, we wind up farther and farther from the life God intended for us.

Thinking of God's will this way usually leads to seeing our lives as a series of forking paths, where every decision makes it harder and harder to be in the perfect will of God. We can end up obsessing over every choice out of the fear we'll miss out on God's perfect will. We can become daunted by small decisions because, in our minds, these choices might have potentially devastating consequences ("If only I'd taken the 405 instead of the 5 I wouldn't have arrived at the party five minutes late and missed the chance to meet the girl or guy of my dreams!").

Sadly, this conventional view of "finding God's will" usually ends up feeling like a divine game of hide-and-seek, producing an unhealthy preoccupation with the future and paralysis in the present. We need to have a better understanding of God's will than this. Thankfully, there's a better way forward. It's time to put down the Magic 8-Ball and pick up the Bible.
